# Causeway Drainage Project is Underway

Construction along our section of the Treasure Island Causeway has begun. It is expected to last approximately seven months, completion scheduled for May 2022. Keystone Excavators were awarded the contract and are doing the installation of stormwater infrastructure and rehabilitation of the roadway. Work in the swale and shoulder areas including material staging and a safety buffer will cause lane closures during this process. The majority of the work will be done during normal work hours to minimize disturbance to neighboring residents. No full road closures are planned.

The project also includes pedestrian improvements, focused on 79th Street. Curb ramps will be installed, crosswalks will be re-striped, and rapid flashing beacons will be installed at the intersection prior to the east bridge.

New landscaping will be added, including year-round colorful groups of Florida friendly plants requiring less irrigation, chemicals, and maintenance. When this median land-scaping proposal goes out to bid, the city will also request quotes to plant palm trees in the shoulder areas. They realize this won't hide the fences but may distract them visually. No bushes or major vegetation can be planted here due to the drainage features.

Finally, the lighting will be changed to match the decorative light poles as seen on the west side of the bascule bridge. These lights will have their power underground, getting rid of unsightly wires.

We should all be thrilled this work is finally getting accomplished!
















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# NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

Greetings again from Causeway Blvd South.

Bonnie and I continue to be in awe with how wonderful this neighborhood is. It seems as if we make a new friend weekly as we walk through the neighborhood and meet our new and interesting neighbors.

Last spring, I wrote in the newsletter that if folks followed the three tenants of neighborhood security (see below) that our neighborhood would see a lowering of criminal activity. Well, it worked. Car break ins and thefts went down significantly as per the SPPD. Congrats on helping keep our hood safe. However, car thefts and break ins are a cyclical event that tends to move from neighborhood to neighborhood in Saint Petersburg, so as a reminder in order to keep lowering criminal activity please follow the tenants below.

Use the following steps as a guide to help ensure your family and your property stays crime free.

- 1. Present yourself as a hard target.
  - a. Lock your homes and your vehicles, always, but especially at night.
  - b. Remove valet keys from your console when not actively using them. Many people do not realize that they have valet keys. They are generally stored in the glove box and may be in your owner's manual. These keys will not open your vehicle door but they will start your car, thus refer to step 1.
  - c. Use motion detection lights that span the range of your yard to the street.
  - d. Mount inexpensive security cameras that cover your entrances as well as your vehicles. (I will help you set these up for free, you buy them, I'll set them up)
  - e. Mount these cameras in an overt manner so they can be seen by prospecting criminals.
  - f. Monitor your cameras and report any suspicious activity to the police.
- 2. Be a neighbor. Monitor your neighbor's property while they are away on vacation or out of town. Download the Nextdoor Application. This app will help inform you of criminal and dangerous activities in ours and surrounding neighborhoods, allowing you to stay one step ahead.
- 3. Become a member of the Neighborhood Watch. (Again, a Shameless Plug)

If you follow these steps, Causeway Isles will be safer for it. Nothing will completely stop criminal activity, but with your help, we can minimize it. I want to have at least one neighborhood watch member on every street both east and west of 79<sup>th</sup> street. I will run quarterly meetings at my home and provide food and beverages. 



# ICIOUS CHRISTMA

# **Peppermint Meringues Recipe**

3 large egg whites Pinch of Salt

34 cup sugar

1/4 tsp cream of tartar

1/4 tsp pure peppermint extract

**Red Gel Food Coloring** 

1. Preheat oven to 250°. Line 2 baking sheets with parchment paper. Beat the egg whites and salt in a large bowl with a mixer on medium-high speed until frothy. Gradually beat in the sugar and cream of tartar and beat until stiff peaks form, about 6 minutes. Add the peppermint extract and beat 2 more minutes.


2. Using a small pastry brush, paint 4 1/4 inch wide stripes of red gel food coloring inside a piping bag fitted with a 1/2 inch wide tip. Fill with the meringue.

3. Pipe 2-inch spirals about 2 inches apart onto the baking sheets. Bake the meringues 1 hour, then turn off the oven and let them dry in the oven, about 2 more hours.

# Mini Circles Update by Ed Gessen

Here is the latest update on the 79<sup>th</sup> Street Traffic Calming Program (aka, Mini Circles). Our City Neighborhood Traffic Manager, Mr. Michael Fredrick, tells us that the project will be looked at again in about 9 months (August/September, 2022) to resume the testing.

Per Mr. Fredrick, "We are just putting together our Fiscal Year 2022 sidewalk program. I have instructed our Engineering Department to go out to bid for construction of this location as part of other sidewalk projects, which should give us a better price then last time.

With any luck, in 9 months or so, we should have a contractor ready to construct and we can then put back the test mini Circles for a review.

I will keep you posted as the work proceeds."

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
